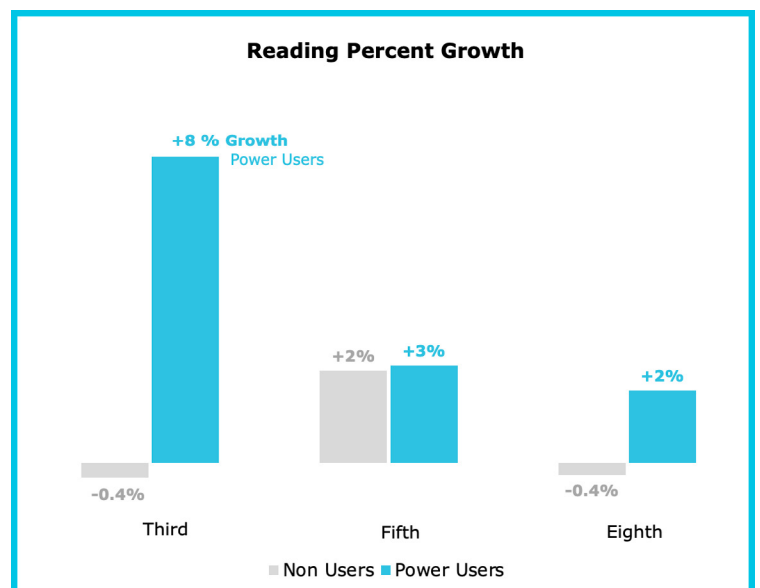
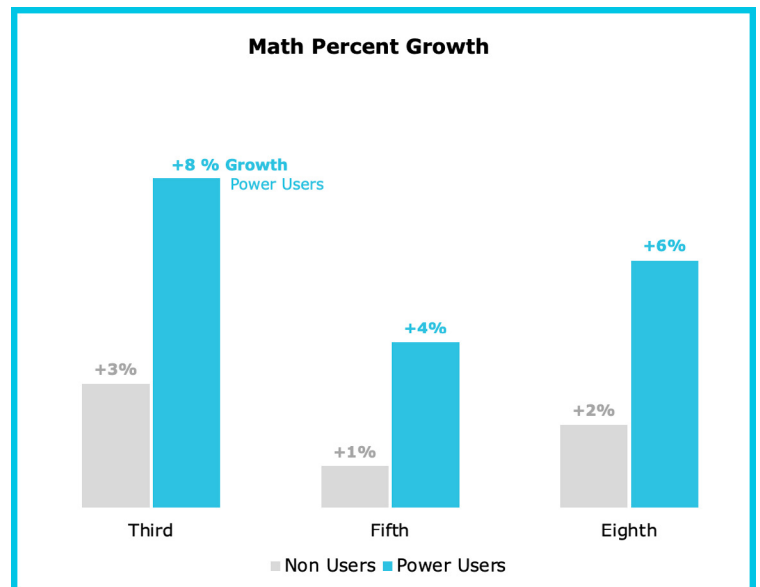

Classworks Students Experience Growth in Reading and Math!

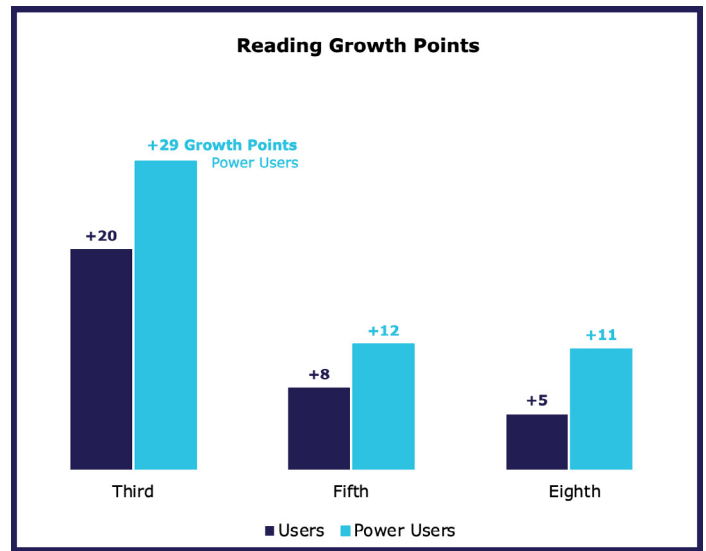
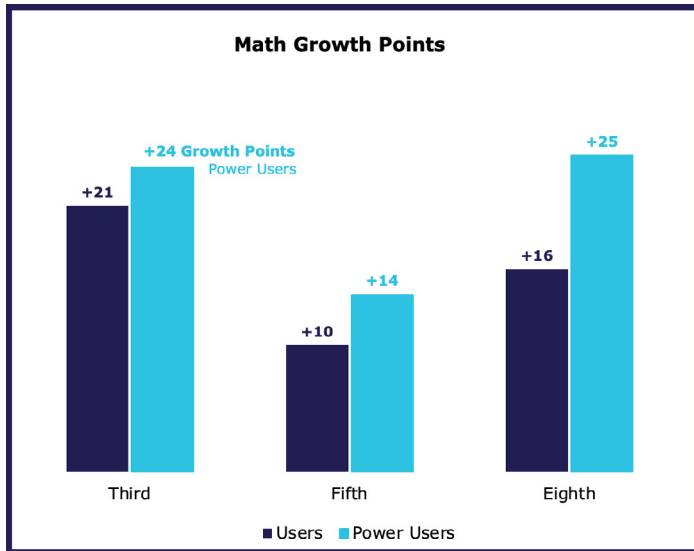
Students in major promotion grades who used Classworks Individualized Learning as recommended (Power Users) experienced more growth on the Classworks Reading and Math Universal Screener Assessments when compared to their peers who did not use Classworks during the same period.

Students in grades three, five, and eight who used Classworks during the 2022-2023 school year achieved an average of 3% more growth in reading and 4% more growth in math.
